Project teams are preparing their games

At Heritage4Growth we are currently working on apps that will include 5 cultural games in all partner cities: Oradea, Konya, Liberec, Rome, and Rhodos. These games will allow you to explore and learn about the rich and diverse heritage of these places in a fun and interactive way.



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For example, in Liberec, you can look forward to a historical adventure game that follows the player's quest to find out the truth about their uncle's lost friend, Alois, who disappeared many years ago. The player receives a letter from their uncle, who regrets that he never found out what happened to Alois and asks the player for answers.



The player embarks on a journey to find clues and solve puzzles that will reveal Alois's story. Along the way, the player visits 14 locations around the world and learns about their history and culture. For example, The František Xaver Šalda Theatre, the Library, the Liberec barracks, the North Bohemian Museum, the Spa, or the Dam. The player also discovers that Alois was no ordinary man at all, but a true hero who had a secret mission and influenced the lives of many people he met. The game also has sci-fi elements that add to the mystery and intrigue of Alois's fate.



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Rome

The game development is progressing well also in other cities. For example, in Rome, ten participants from Italy, representing the Italian Hospitality School, took part in an intensive training course on gamification and tourism service design (LTTA) in Rhodes. They applied the knowledge they gained from the online training to create the game's story, plot and objective.

They also collaborate with La Sapienza University of Rome, the oldest and largest university in the city, and involved its tourism faculty in the project. Three students from the university joined the online training and the LTTA in Rhodes. The school is now working on completing PR2 and PR3. The Italian Hospitality School has been actively participating in all the project activities and meetings, as well as disseminating the project results. The school will also host the International conference in Rome in December 2023 to showcase the project outcomes.
