#### Reference 1 - 0,08% Coverage

The dragon was incorporated in the Ljubljana coat of arms in the 17th century and this fountain, another work by Johannes Komersteiner, is from the same period.

#### Reference 2 - 0,12% Coverage

The gargantuan sugar refinery later on housed Ljubljana's destitute and was the place where two foremost Modernist poets, Dragotin Kette and Josip Murn, died.

#### Reference 3 - 0,19% Coverage

The gallery mostly focuses on photography and has hosted world-renowned artists, who tackle urgent social, political, environmental and humanist themes.

#### Reference 4 - 0,01% Coverage

#### Reference 5 - 0,14% Coverage

Due to unstable marsh ground where floods are frequent, Plečnik built the church on piles and elevated the sacred nave to the first floor - the elevated ground floor is used by the parish priest.

The bridge used to host butchers, later on shoemakers, and at its side the townspeople sank cheating bakers into the river.

#### Reference 7 - 0,09% Coverage

Publication of his monumental work The Glory of the Duchy of Carniola bankrupted him, but his thorough examination of the central Slovenian land proved invaluable to future researchers.

#### Reference 8 - 0,15% Coverage

Ivana Kobilca has been regarded as one of Slovenia's greatest artists since her death in 1926, but it still took decades to get a street named after her and for a plaque to be placed on the house where she lived.

Reber - one of the narrow, steep, cobbled streets to Ljubljana Castle, which people once called the Trail of Fools or Kurja steza because of its dangerous slope.
